When

The time commitment for 15–17-year-olds for this role is a minimum of 2.5 hours weekly for 6 weeks. If you are available for 10 weeks then that is great, but we understand you may be restricted to just the summer holiday period.

If you are successful in your application, you will be offered a pre-booked weekly slot, based on your availability, with the option to choose additional/alternative volunteer shifts when you just want to have even more fun or cannot make your usual time, or need to take time out for a family holiday.

About You

The opportunity is open to anyone 15 years of age and over. As with all our roles, we welcome applications from our globally diverse community.

You should possess good communication and listening skills, and the ability to work as part of a team.

The Role

The role of volunteer Exhibition Guide is to interact with visitors and make them welcome. It is anticipated there will be variety of questions and reactions that people will have about the content of the material, and we will train you to assist them. You will also help to keep the exhibits safe and encourage visitors to have fun in the play zone.

This role relates specifically to our summer 2024 exhibition with the option to continue volunteering in other available roles at RAMM once it closes. The available shifts will be 10:30 to 13:00 and 13:00 to 15:30, excluding Mondays and Bank Holidays when the museum is closed.

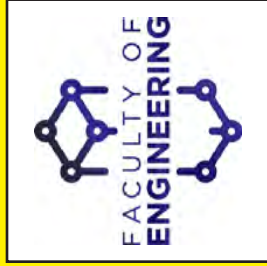
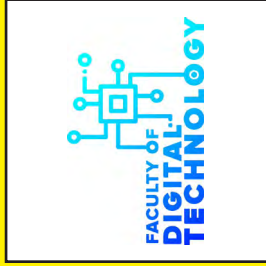

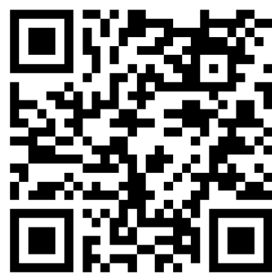

Changes to Application Requirements for Languages Degrees at Bristol

Bristol offers degrees in [French](#), [German](#), [Italian](#), [Portuguese](#) (joint honours only), [Russian](#) and [Spanish](#). These can be studied:

- alone (except Portuguese)
- in combination with each other (for one-, two- and three-language programmes see [BA Modern Languages](#))

- in combination with a wide variety of other subjects: Comparative Literatures and Cultures, English, Film, History, History of Art, International Business Management, Law, Music, Philosophy, Politics and Theatre.

We have recently **made some changes** to our admissions requirements for these degree programmes, as follows:

- **For BA Modern Languages:** applicants who are not taking a language at A level (or the equivalent), but are taking a standalone language qualification at CEFR level B1 (in addition to three A levels or the equivalent) will now be considered for entry. Please see the [Admissions Statement](#) for full details.
- **For all joint schools degree programmes (a language and another subject) except Law/MFL combinations:** applicants no longer need to be taking a language A level (or equivalent) to be eligible to apply. Those who arrive with A level standard will go into the post-A level group; those without will go into the beginners' (ab initio) group.
- **For Law/MFL combinations:** from September 2025 applicants must still be taking an A level (or equivalent) in the language for which they are applying, however, we may also accept a standalone language qualification in the language you intend on studying at CEFR level B1. 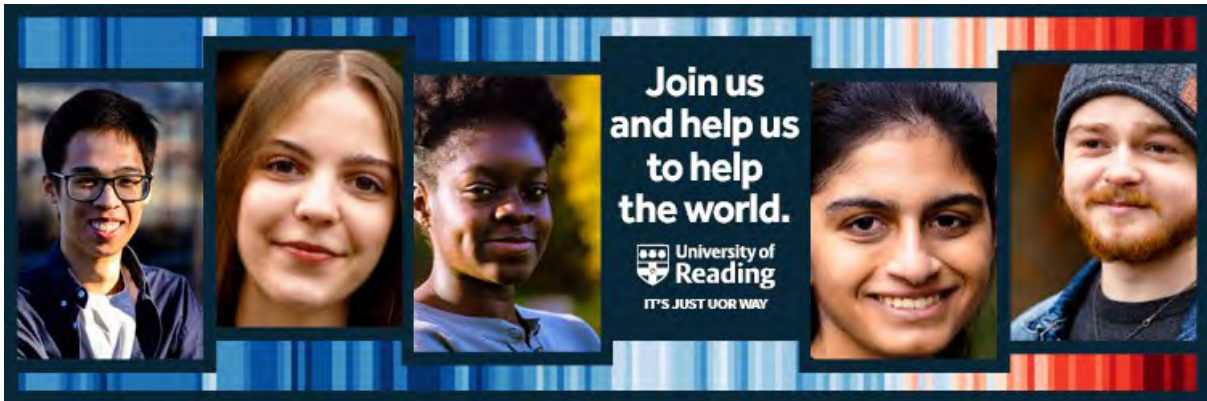

Admissions Updates

Some of you might have already seen this, but for some subjects here at Cambridge the A-level requirements have been changed for this coming application round (October 2024).

- Medicine - Students **have** to take Chemistry, and then two others from Maths, Biology, Physics, or Further Mathematics (Psychology and Computer Science do not count as science A-levels for Medicine)
- Computer Science – Further Maths is required if the school offers it.
- Natural Sciences (physical and biological) – Applicants are now required to take Maths **and** 2 other science subjects.
- Changes to entrance exams:
 - Medicine – no more BMAT, we are now using the UCAT
 - Engineering – no more ENGAA, we now use the ESAT – **students now have to register themselves for this, no longer taken through schools**
 - Natural Sciences – no more NSAA, we now use the ESAT - **students now have to register themselves for this, no longer taken through schools**

If any of your students are affected by these changes (i.e. they now don't have the correct combination of A-level subjects) we recommend that they contact a few colleges to see if they would be able to apply with their current combination – some colleges' admissions tutors are willing to be flexible.

Maths Online Open Day

For students thinking of maths at Oxbridge, we're running an online open evening. A chance to hear from Corpus' directors of studies and undergrads about what it's like to study maths here at Cambridge. In addition, there'll be a super-curricular lecture from Prof David Abrahams, '*Numbers, Complex Numbers, and Numerous Applications*'.

Students can register themselves, open to all and might be of interest to Y11s (or equivalent) as well, with no limitations on numbers from individual schools

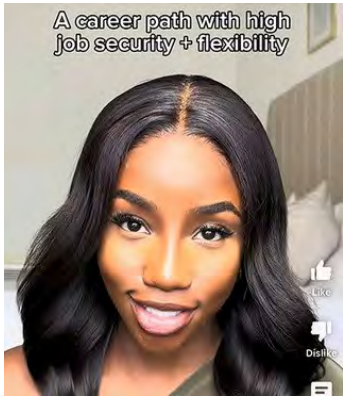
