

In the News:

68% of school leavers worried about their money skills

<u>GoHenry</u> has released new research this week on the provision of financial education in schools. The debit card & financial education app found that 68% of 18-year-olds were worried about entering adult life without the money skills they needed.

The secondary school students they surveyed thought it could be useful to have around 45 minutes of financial education each week. They were most interested in topics such as how to save and buy a house, as well as how to build their earnings throughout their career.

The UK Parliament is currently conducting an inquiry into how financial education could be strengthened. Do you feel your students learn enough about money management at school?

The research was conducted by Censuswide with a sample of 2,000 UK Children aged 6–18-year-olds (Minimum of 50 respondents per age).
