We have been educating bright students from Devon for over one hundred years now. The outcomes for young people who come here are excellent and our academic results place us as one of the top schools nationally for both attainment and progress. Through careful balancing of tradition and identity with high expectations and a modern curriculum, our students go on to top universities, apprenticeships and employment opportunities,

However, these facts do not convey the real essence of our school, which is more about a way of thinking. It is about helping our pupils to believe they can achieve anything and giving them the skills and high self-esteem to do so.

We are high achieving and proud of it; we are not afraid to celebrate the elite whether in the sphere of academia, sport or the arts. However, because we know that students work better when they are happy and relaxed, we also have an enormous amount of fun. Our strong house culture means that students are involved in activities like our whole school sponsored walk from Brixham back to Torquay, and the House Shout where students and staff compete in their Houses to sing a song to the rest of the school.

We believe that students here are 'history makers' of the future, and the curriculum enables them to develop their character skills and self-esteem, alongside their academic success.

Our extra-curricular opportunities, including trips and clubs, help develop the character skills in our students. These skills include leadership, aiming high, staying positive, creativity, problem solving, speaking, listening and teamwork and were recognised by Ofsted in 2023 "opportunities for pupils to lead and volunteer are exceptional". We want our young people to have lots of fun and experiences during their time at TGGS and our curriculum is designed with that in mind. Trips locally to Plymouth Marine Aquarium, Bodmin Jail, Morwellham Quay, Paignton Zoo, Exeter, Plymouth and Torquay Theatres, River Dart Country Park, Torquay dry ski slope and many more. Trips nationally to London Houses of Parliament, Bude Adventure, Bristol, Manor House Activities Okehampton, Tate St Ives, Lake District, Cambridge University, Oxford University and various geological sites, amongst others. Further afield, we have seen our students trek across glaciers in Iceland, lay wreaths at the Menin Gate during trips to the Belgian battlefields, ski down slopes in Italy and France, visit the United Nations HQ in Switzerland, and get an insight into life for holocaust captives in Auschwitz, Poland. These are just some examples of the many stimulating off-site activities, with more varied and exciting opportunities being added in the future.

We are proud of our pastoral system where we get to know all our students well. Staff respond quickly and efficiently to ensure that they feel happy and secure, as recognised by Ofsted in 2023 "relationships between pupils and staff are highly supportive" and "the school's high ambition for what pupils can achieve academically is balanced with a focus on them becoming a well rounded person."

As the only state, selective girls' school in the area and one of a small number of schools nationally that have recently been judged as Outstanding in every Ofsted category, Torquay Girls' Grammar School is a truly exceptional choice for the education of your child.
