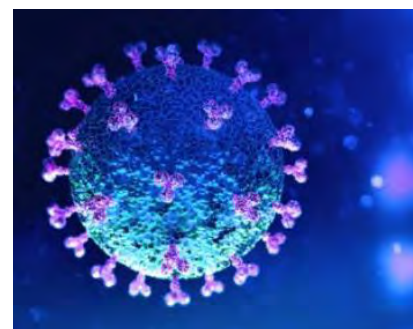

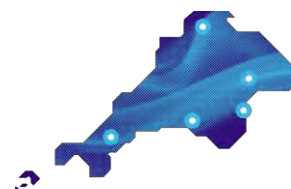

Insight into University Residential



Insight into University Residential Experience (previously known as Headstart) are summer schools run over 4 or 5 days where students get a taster of university life and an insight into a specific STEM subject. Students will get the opportunity to experience university style lectures and work on activities and group projects with the support of academics and student mentors. Students will stay in halls of residence and will take part in social activities in the evenings.

These courses are for Year 12/S5-6 students and are a great way to try out a STEM subject at university before applying. This allows students to make a better informed decision for their UCAS application, as well as meeting like-minded students from all over the UK.

These summer schools are run for small groups (on average 30 students) and so places are limited.

Good news from Liverpool

The University of Liverpool has climbed eight places to 160th in the 2025 Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings. This mirrors the University's improvement across both international and domestic assessments earlier this year, including an 11 place rise to 165th in the 2025 QS World University Rankings, plus 23rd in the Times and Sunday Times Good University Guide, 19th place in the Complete University Guide, and a gold ranking for the Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF).

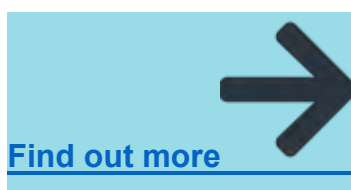
Sheffield Live

Online subject tasters

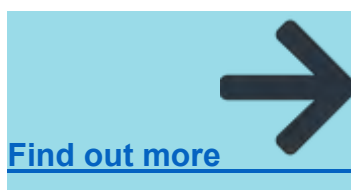

Access

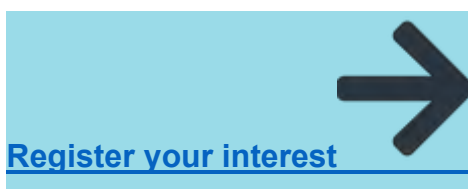
Open Days and our Access+ Travel Bursary

Are you working with students who are eligible for [Access+](#)? We know that sometimes the cost of travel can make visiting us in person challenging, but if any students you work with meet our Access+ criteria, we might be able to refund their travel. Students can claim back travel expenses if they visit us on open days, on-campus subject taster events, offer holder interviews and offer holder days. 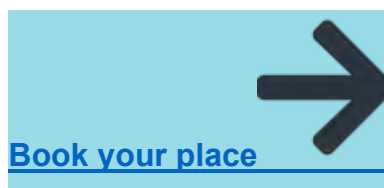

Sociology/Education Virtual Seminar: The Role of the Father -

How does father involvement make a difference in children's education?

12th November: 10:10 - 10:55. Channel Talent.

Parents obviously shape children's educational outcomes, from influencing early cognitive development through to the forms of encouragement given later in the schooling journey. Equally obviously, parental involvement varies for many reasons and is affected by a range of factors. One of those factors is gender. Therefore, examining the role of fathers can highlight a number of sociological issues related to gendered role expectations, family routines and working patterns, and institutional barriers.

In this session, Dr Mark Pulsford from the University of Warwick will consider the question: how does father involvement make a difference in children's education? We will think about the nature and value of fathers' educational involvement (is there evidence that this is different to mothers'?) and outline the barriers that fathers can face to being involved.

Covering the latest theories and research findings on parental involvement and engagement, and introducing a research case study that will help attendees think about 'father-inclusive' schools, this session will be of interest to a wide range of students and teachers in social science subjects.

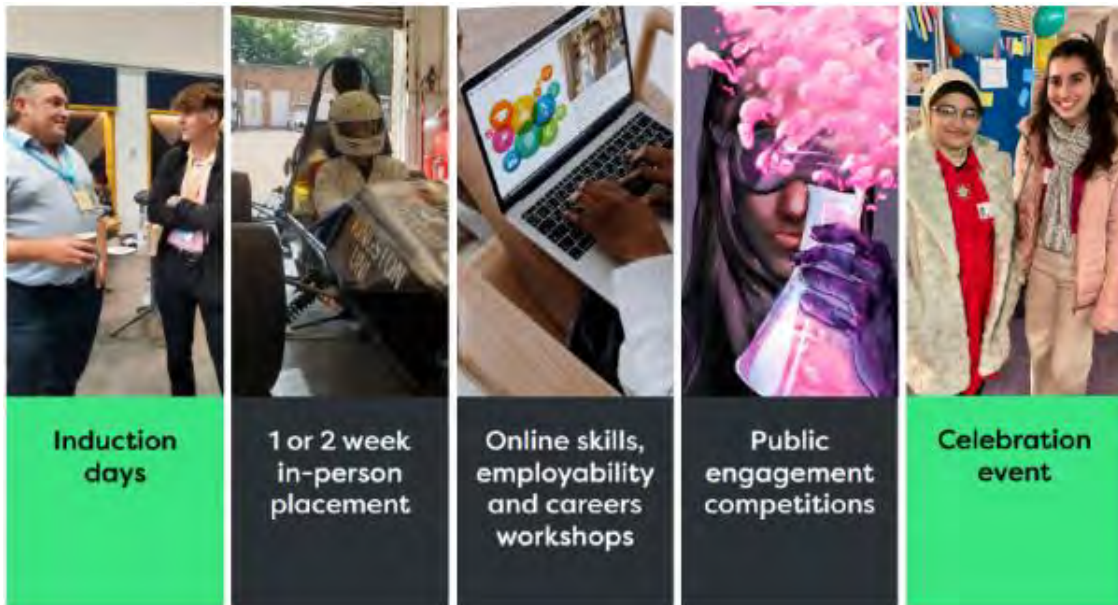

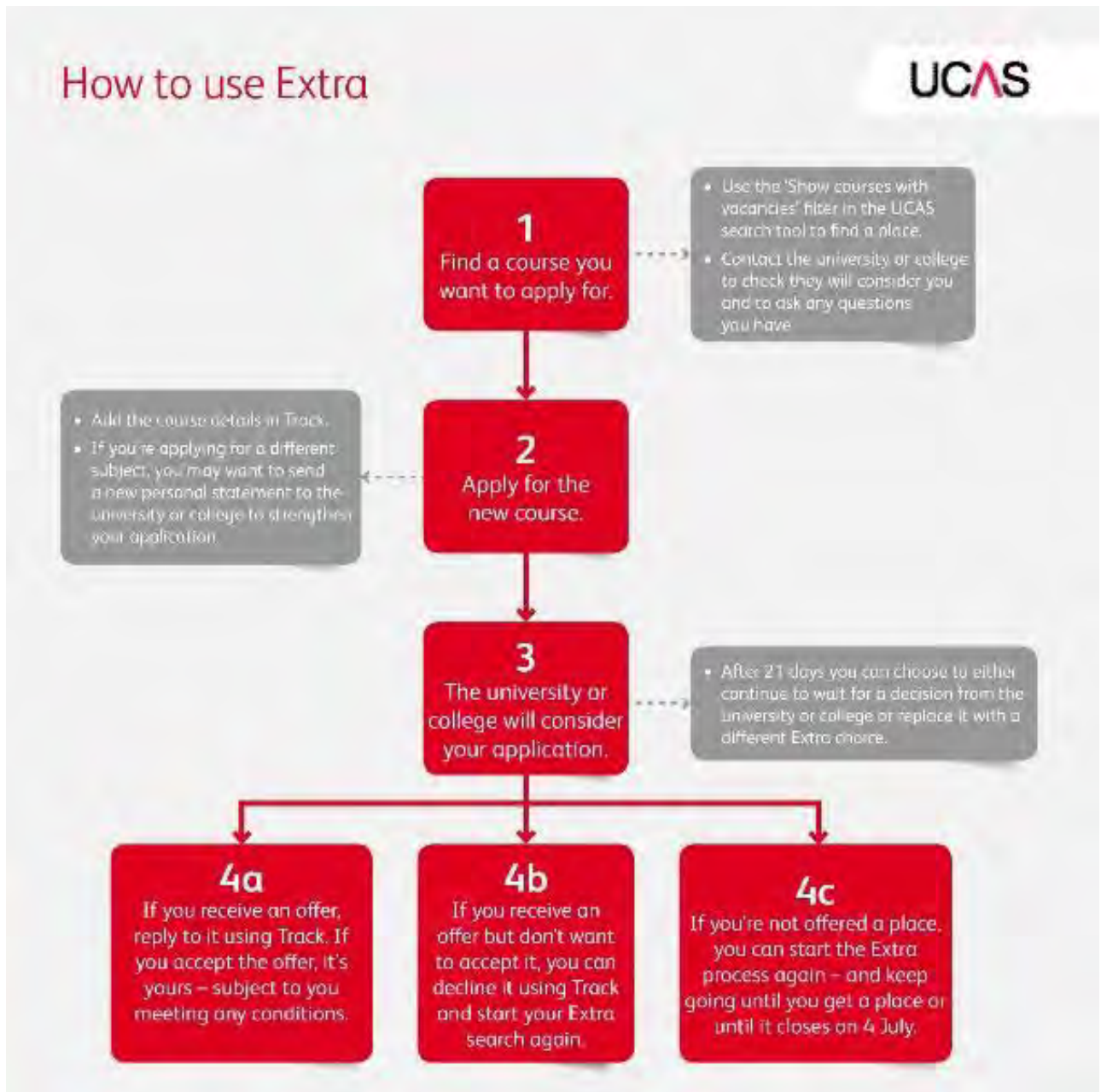

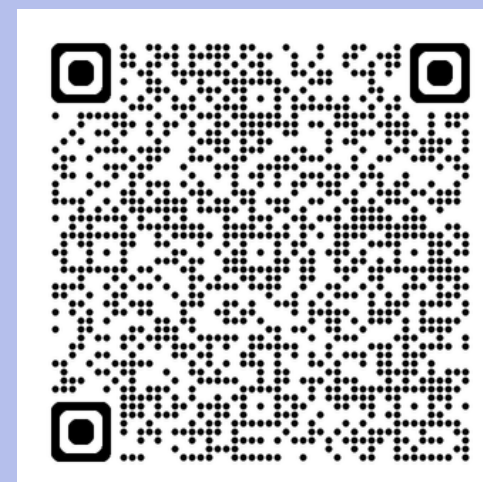
