In recent weeks we've had a host of cultural events taking place on campus, here are just some of the highlights...



Holi Colour Party

The University of Warwick campus celebrated the beginning of spring this week with a Holi Colour Party. Over 400 students celebrated in the traditional way by throwing brightly coloured powder at each other. Holi is a Hindu festival that celebrates spring, love, and new life. Across the world it will be celebrated on the 25th March but Warwick students wanted to celebrate early so more people could enjoy the event, as the official date falls during the student holiday period.

Community Iftar

Muslim students and staff in our community will be observing Ramadan, a holy month of reflection and fasting. Throughout Ramadan, Warwick's Islamic Society is hosting free Iftar for the Warwick community every evening for the whole month in our very own Islamic Prayer Hall located on campus. Iftar is the meal eaten at sunset to break the fast. This is available for all staff, students and the wider local community.

Carnaval

Students were delighted to welcome Carnaval onto campus for the very first time this year, with celebrations led by the Latin American and Portuguese Speaking Societies here at Warwick. 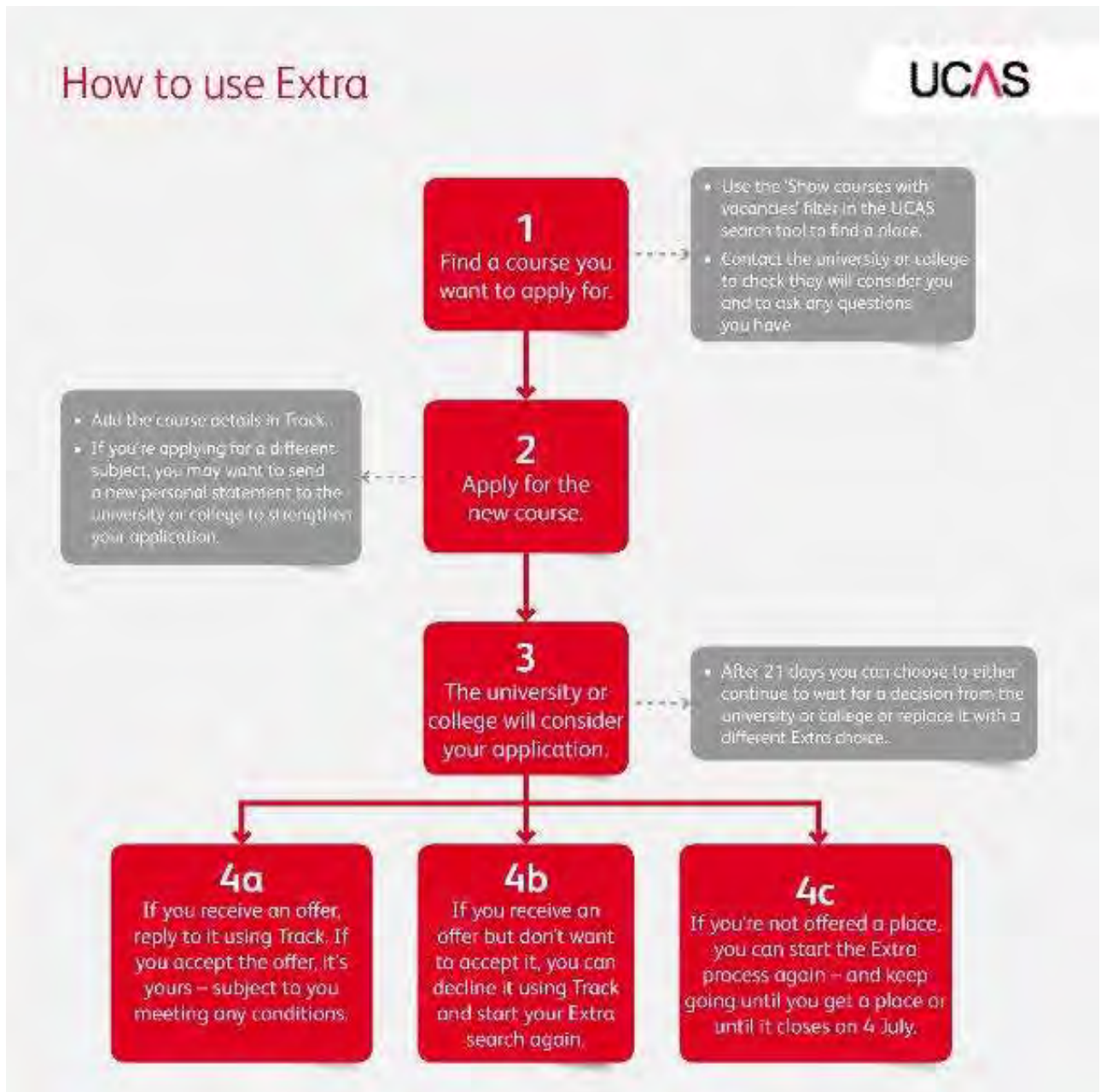
