

Join our call to action.





To achieve Net Zero, we must extract an immense amount of minerals and raw materials to build our renewable energies and technologies. A career in minerals has never been more exciting, and more important to humankind.

This event is for students to meet with and hear from members of industry, academia and government about all the opportunities and progression options that exist here in the UK, featuring presentations, interactive exhibitions, and career insights into critical minerals.

On behalf of the Critical Minerals Association (UK), I would like to bring to your attention a free event they are hosting with the Natural History Museum in London on the 3rd of July from 12:00-17:00. Please see flyers attached.

The Critical Minerals Association (UK) is partnering with the Natural History Museum and the NERC TARG ET Mineral Resources CDT (Centre for Doctoral Training) to deliver a 'Call to

Action: Careers for Next Generation Minerals'. This event, held at the iconic Natural History Museum in Sou th Kensington, will give dozens of students, teachers and parents

the opportunity to speak with industry, academia and government about all the exciting opportunities a nd diverse progression options that exist here in the UK for young people to pursue a career in critical mi nerals. The event includes subject talks, interactive exhibitions and opportunity to network with industry partners (e.g. Cornish Metals, Institute of Quarrying). Speakers include, Ass. Prof Dan Smith (UoL), and Eva Marquis and Chris Stocker both formerly UoL.

What are critical minerals?

Critical minerals are the building blocks of the modern and green economy. Without these minerals, our manufacturing, aerospace, technology and renewable energy sectors cannot function. The UK's fastgrowing skills gaps are a major concern not just to industry, but to the UK's longterm national security and economic growth. We need critical minerals to achieve Net Zero, and attractin g young people to work in this sector is crucial to ensure the emergence of our future green and circular e conomy.

From exploration geologists uncovering the UK's critical minerals potential and chemical engineers who discover innovate ways to recycle magnets, to social scientists who map our global supply chains and ESG consultants who track life cycle assessments—the opportunities in critical minerals are endless. We're bringing together leading companies and universities to the Natural History Museum on 3 July to tell students more about how they started out , what their jobs are like, and why the UK is such an exciting place to pursue a career in critical minerals.

UCAT 2024 - Booking opens next week

Are any of your students applying to study medicine or dentistry?

UCAT forms part of the entry requirements for all UK medical and dental schools. Please forward this email to your students and encourage them to visit the UCAT website for information on how to book and prepare for the test.

UCAT Essentials - What do I need to know?

What is the UCAT?

UCAT is an admissions test, used by UK Universities to help select applicants for medicine and dentistry programmes. The test is used alongside other selection criteria such as academic qualifications and interviews. The UCAT is delivered on computers in Pearson VUE test centres throughout the UK.

Which Universities require the UCAT?

The universities and courses that require the UCAT can be found on the UCAT website. Students should also check university websites for specific entry requirements.

UCAT Test Dates

UCAT registration is already open and candidates are able to book a test from 18 June onwards. Testing takes place between 8 July and 26 September 2024.
