#### The Library

On 12th October, Challenge Day 1, 157 Year 9 students and 11 staff took the short coach journey to the National Marine Aquarium in Plymouth. The Art Department having been running a trip to this venue for close to 20 years. A myriad of colour, pattern, shape, form, texture and so on are on display from the various aquatic animals and plants -perfect for aspiring art students. This year, as the trip coincided with StemFest, pupils were lucky enough to get to try a variety of workshops, including Creative Writing and Visual Art, Physical Theatre and Crafts and Creative movement, as well as the usual Observational Drawing Tour.

Although the day was very 'full-on', the students responded fantastically to the challenges laid before them and behaved excellently throughout the day - the aquarium staff personally thanked me for this.



The students saw work from such artists as Picasso, Henry Moore, Patrick Heron and Ben Nicholson, amongst many others. They were particularly impressed with the Hepworth Museum, which was the sculptor's home, her studio and the venue for a large collection of her work.

The trip was beneficial as it enabled the students to see the landscape and environment which influenced many of the 20th century St Ives Modernist artists.

It was a fantastic day with students producing lots of great drawing of the art on display and of the environment, as well as capturing the essence of the day photographically.
